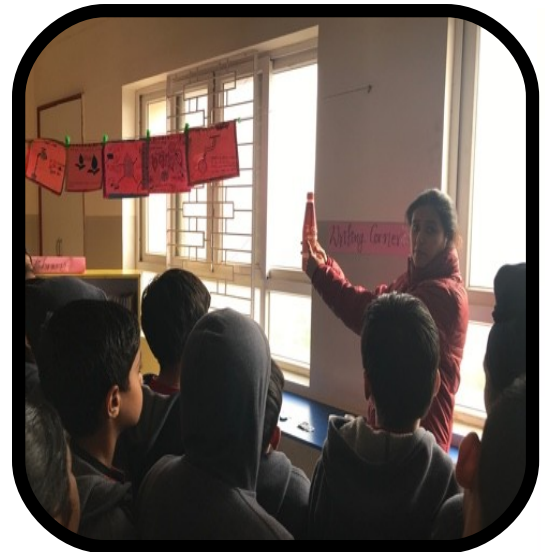
Grandparents' Day Grades (Foundation - UKG)

Reading the expiry date and the manufacturing dates on medicines and other edible food items was taught to the students of grade 4A and B. Along with this they were also made clear what the green, red and brown dots in a square signify on the food items. Students were explained that green signifies hundred percent vegetarian, red depicts the non vegetarian and brown tells that it contains egg only.

Students themselves read the dates and checked the food items such as coke, vinegar and baking soda for veg or non veg.

To enhance their knowledge they were also given a briefing on how to dispose of the expired medicines.

The beautiful Saturday morning started with a lovely workout. The children of Grades 2 to 5 enjoyed doing a 'Mass PT' as a part of their 'House Activity'. In the art corner ,they made projects on wild and farm animals and showed various medicinal plants like Tulsi,Aloe Vera,Turmeric,Curry leaves,Coriander and also explained their uses.
