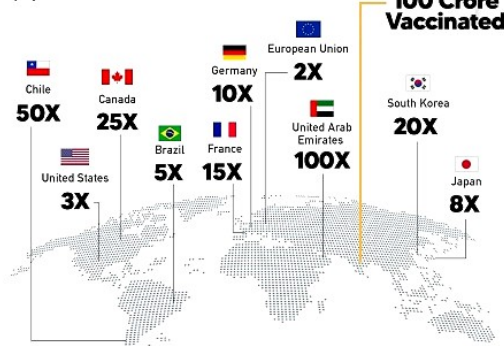

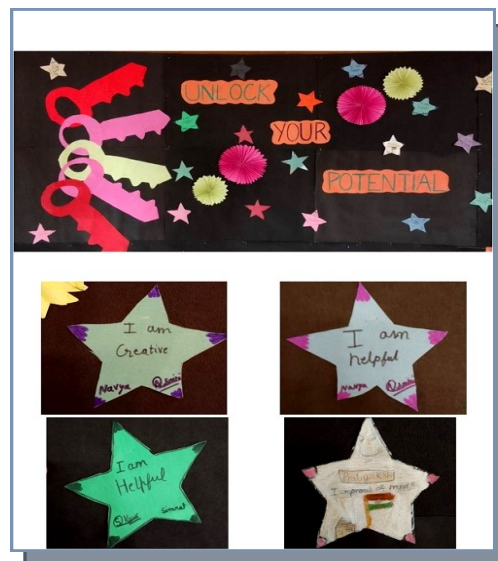
Shadow
