MOCK FIRE DRILL

Teachers had prepared students in advance and they were instructed to take the nearest exit. A group of fire fighters armed with necessary equipment required for fire fighting and rescue operations positioned themselves to guide and assist the students during the fire drill. They explained and demonstrated improvised methods that should be adopted by everyone in an emergency situation.

VISIT TO AN INDUSTRY



Students of Grades 5 to 8 went on an educational trip to an Iron and Steel Industry in Industrial Area, Chandigarh on 20th November. The objective behind the visit was to make students acquainted with the various activities that are carried out in the manufacturing of different products. Students were shown the production of many iron and steel goods, such as rolled and coated steel including recycled material. Students were also made aware about the occupational hazards in such industries and what all precautions are to be taken while working there. They were amazed to see the manufacturing of iron and how steel sheets are categorized into gauges and rolled into sheets. Students also tried their hand at the welding process. Both the students brought laurels to our school by winning Gold medals in Taekwondo Poomsae.
